

#### What is emergency temporary housing?

- Based on the Disaster Relief Act, the prefecture secures dwellings for disaster-stricken households that do not have housing as a result of having lost their homes in the Great East Japan Earthquake.
- Under the Disaster Relief Act, we have constructed and provided temporary (container-type) housing, but because the damage caused by the Great East Japan Earthquake was extensive, and many people lost their residences in disaster-affected municipalities, we have also provided apartment-type housing through the prefecture as an alternative option. Existing housing resources such as disaster public housing are also handled in the same way to maximize their effective use.
