
Miyagi Disaster Mental Health Care Center: Project

The Miyagi Disaster Mental Health Care Center primarily operates the following six projects.

This bulletin mainly reported on the following project items.



Resident support

Consultation and support with the objective of preventing mental illness and improving mental health for disaster victims:

Consultation support activities (e.g., interview consultations, telephone consultations)

Planning and management of events for residents in the affected area

Raising public awareness

Dissemination and increasing awareness of information relating to mental health

Workshops and lectures for the general public Creation and distribution of educational pamphlets, dissemination of information through public relations magazines, websites, etc.

Research

Surveys and research to understand the situation of disaster areas and victims

Supporter support

Support for mental health activities and maintenance of supporters' physical/mental health, such as municipal staff and temporary housing support staff

Dispatch of professionals to local governments Participation in consultations, supervision, and case meetings

Establishing a mental health consultation desk for supporters

Administrative work support

Human resource development

Spreading knowledge and training for professionals and supporters involved in mental health

Supporting skills-related training case study meetings Earthquake disaster mental care exchange meetings
